### NEEDED FOR FINISHING:

(25) WORD BLOCKS MADE USING MINI ALPHABET QUILT LETTERING BY PRIMITIVE GATHERINGS & SETTING INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN IN QAL BLOG POSTS

(27) 5½" x 7½" FILLER BLOCKS \*3 each of 9 block patterns

3/4 YARD BACKGROUND FABRIC FOR EXTRA SASHINGS & OUTER BORDERS \*If not adding outer borders, you only need (2) 1½"x7½" extra sashing pieces

3/4 YARD BINDING (Bella Solid in Christmas Red 9900 16)


7 YARDS BACKING

\*Or 21/2 Yards of 108" Wideback Fabric



#### **CUTTING & PREPPING:**

- 1. From the ¾ Yard of background fabric:
- Cut (9) 2" x WOF strips.
- Join strips end to end to make one long strip. Press seams open.
- Subcut (2) 2" x 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ " side borders, and (2) 2" x 75 $\frac{1}{2}$ " top/bottom borders.
- From the remainder, cut (2) 1½"x7½" extra sashing pieces.
- 2. Optional: From ONE of your three GRANNY'S KISSES FILLER BLOCKS, trim the block down to 4½"x7½". If you are making the quilt exactly as shown in this pattern, the 3rd row (TREE PIE CIDER) is 1" longer than the others. You could also leave this block as-is, and plan to trim ½" off either side of the row as you assemble the quilt top all together.



Trim ONE BLOCK to 4½"x7½"

#### ASSEMBLY:

3. Join blocks together into rows as shown. Make sure to add the two extra sashing strips into ROWS 2 & 10, and to use the trimmed filler block in Row 3 if desired (all are noted with the diagrams as well). Each row should measure  $72\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ ".


### ASSEMBLY (cont'd):

- 4. Join the rows together to form quilt top center, following the quilt image on the first page of these instructions. Center will measure  $72\frac{1}{2}$ "x91 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". A few tips:
  - Fold each row in half to find the center point, and then each side again to find the quarter points. Mark for each row, and then pin at these points when you begin to sew together as well as the beginning and end of the rows. Any fullness can be eased between the pins.
  - Join the rows into sets of 2, then the 2's into sets of 4. There are 13 rows, so add the last row onto a set of 4 to make (2) sets of 4 and (1) set of 5.
  - Be careful not to sew any rows on upside down!
  - Press seams open or to the side as you go, not all at the end.
- 5. Add (2) 2"x91½" borders on either side of quilt center. Press seams to the borders.
- 6. Add (2)  $2"x75\frac{1}{2}"$  borders on top and bottom of quilt center. Press seams to the borders. Quilt top will measure  $75\frac{1}{2}"x94\frac{1}{2}"$ .
- 7. Recommended: Whether you add borders or not, but ESPECIALLY if you do not add borders, stay stitch around the outside of your quilt top. This will prevent any seams from separating during quilting.
- 8. Baste, Quilt, Bind, and Enjoy!

Just a reminder, the lettering for this QAL is from the pattern-for-purchase Mini Alphabet Quilt by Primitive Gatherings (PRI 442). You can find the pattern at your local quilt shop (or they can order it for you), and select retailers have the pattern as a PDF download.



We've given you the words assembly along the way every month, but if you want to make any changes, here's the quick 'math' behind a block:



A. Each Letter Finished = 4"x5"

B. Each Sashing between Letters Finished = 1"x5"

C. Each Top/Bottom border Finished = 1"x (width of letters + sashings)

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
