This quilt was made with Cake Mix Recipe 10 - Block 1.

Fabric Requirements:

48 Print Layer Cake Squares **or** Color Cuts II Cake Cuts - 1 each of Juniper / Red Maple / Gingerbread / Pecan Pie

- **Note:** If using the Color Cuts II Cake Cuts, only 48 squares are used - 1 of each print from each Cake Cut assortment.

4 1/2 yards for block backgrounds, sashing and borders - Rosewood by 3 Sisters 44188 21

3/4 yard for binding

4 1/4 yards for Backing

8 7 6 5 4 3 2 1

Cutting:

From the background yardage, please cut the following:

Cut 11 strips – 10" x 42" wof.

- From each strip, cut 4 squares – 10" x 10". Cut 42 total.

Cut 2 strips – 9 1/2" x 42" wof.

- From each strip, cut 27 rectangles – 1 1/2" x 9 1/2". Cut 54.

Cut 10 strips – 1 1/2" x 42" wof.

- From 2 of the strips, cut 3 rectangles from each – 1 1/2" x 9 1/2". (A total of 60 total rectangles.)
- Set the remaining 8 strips aside for the inner border.

Cut 4 strips – 3 1/2" x 42" wof. These are for the outer borders.

Assembly: After stitching the Cake Mix Recipe grid - all seams are a scant 1/4".

Making the Blocks. Layer 1 Color Cut II print square and 1 background square – 10" x 10" – with right sides together. Make 42 pairs.

Pin one sheet of Recipe 10 paper on top of the lighter fabric with enough pins to secure the paper to the fabric while it is being turned and stitched. Then stitch on the dotted lines.

Cut the grids apart on the solid lines. Press the seams to the darker fabric with the paper still on. Remove the paper and trim the points.

Using a scant 1/4" seam allowance, join the square-segments to make 210 total four-patches.

- **Note:** On this quilt, each four-patch was made using two different pieced-square segments. We love scrappy!

Press the seam in one direction - or pop/spin it. The pieced four-patches will measure 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".

Now mix and match the HTS and four-patches from the various grids to make each block - the Block is a mix of Blocks 1 and 2 on the cover, but the four-patches have two different alignments. (Okay, it's not a mix, it's Block 5.)

Join the parts to make three rows - press the seams away from the HTS - towards the four-patches. Or press them open.

Join the three rows to complete the block. Press the seams toward the center row - or press them open.

The block will measure 9 1/2" x 9 1/2". Make 36 blocks.

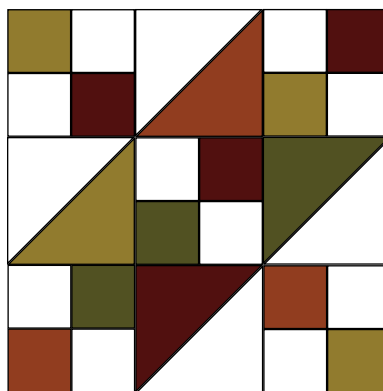
From the six remaining 10" x 10" print squares, cut 1 strip from each square - 1 1/2" x 10". From the strips, cut a total of 25 squares - 1 1/2" x 1 1/2".

Lay out the blocks in six rows of six blocks each - alternating each block with one 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" sashing rectangle.

Join the blocks and sashing strips to complete six rows. Press the seams toward the sashing strips.

Join 8 – 1 1/2" x 42" sashing strips end-to-end with a diagonal or straight seam. Press the seams open. Cut 5 strips 1 1/2" x 59 1/2".

Join the rows and horizontal sashing strips to complete the quilt center. Press the seams toward the sashing strips. The quilt top will now measure 1 1/2" x 59 1/2".



Inner Border. Join two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips with a diagonal seam. Press the seam open. Make 4.

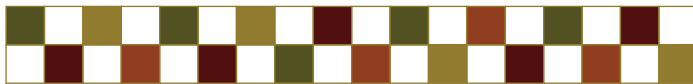
Side Inner Borders. Select two pieced strips. Trim the strips to measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $59\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew the strips to the sides of the quilt top. Press the seams toward the border strips.

Top & Bottom Inner Borders. Trim the remaining two pieced strips to measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $61\frac{1}{2}$ ". Attach the strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top. Press the seams toward the border strips.

Pieced Outer Border. Using the remaining HTSs and four-patches, randomly sort the pieces into the following groups.

- Group A – 9 four-patches
- Group B – 9 four-patches
- Group C – 10 HTSs
- Group D – 12 HTSs

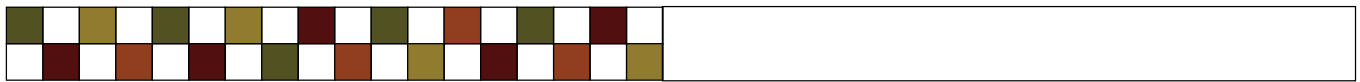
Groups A & B. Join one group of nine four-patches to make a pieced strip measuring $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $27\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press the seams in one direction - or press them open. Repeat to make a second pieced strip.



Select 2 of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" wof background strips. Trim the strips to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $34\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Join each plain strip to one pieced strip. Press the seam toward the background border. These are the **SIDE** borders. Join the strips to the **SIDES** of the quilt top with the four-patch segments as follows:

- **Left Side Border.** The four-patch strip is at the bottom - the lower-left corner.
- **Right Side Border.** The four-patch strip is at the top - the upper-right corner.



Join the border strips to the sides of the quilt top. Press the seams in one direction - whichever direction you prefer. Or press them open.

Groups C & D. Join Group C to make a pieced strip using 10 HTSs that measures $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press the seams in one direction - or press them open. Using Group D, make a second pieced strip using 12 HTSs that measures $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $36\frac{1}{2}$ ".



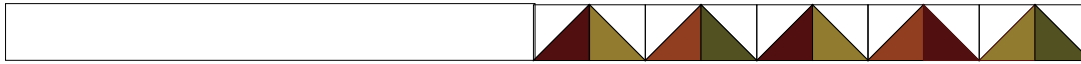
Group C - 10 HTSs

Select 2 of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" wof background strips. Trim the strips to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $31\frac{1}{2}$ " and $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $37\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Join the 10-HTS pieced strip to the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $37\frac{1}{2}$ " plain strip so that the HTSs are on the **right side of the finished strip**. Press the seam toward the plain strip. It will now measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $67\frac{1}{2}$ ". (See next page.)



Sew the border strip to the top edge of the quilt top with the HTSs in the **upper-right corner**.

Now join the 12-HTS pieced strip to the $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 31\frac{1}{2}''$ plain strip so that the HTSs are on the **right side of the finished strip** - as above. Press the seam toward the plain strip. It will now measure $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 67\frac{1}{2}''$.

- Make both HTS borders with the same alignment - remember that one will be turned around - or upside-down... whichever makes more sense. Just make them the same.

Sew the border strip to the bottom edge of the quilt top with the HTSs in the **lower-left corner**.

Optional. I recommend stay-stitching around the outside edge of the quilt top approx. $\frac{1}{8}''$ from the outside edge. This keeps the seams flat and together during quilting.

Quilt and bind as desired.
