

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

3 YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, ROBINS EGG BLOCKS, PIECED BORDER

4½ YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, OFF WHITE BLOCKS, SASHING, BORDERS

SUPPLIES .

(1) CAKE MIX RECIPE 7 FOUNDATION RECIPE CARDS



70" × 79" PIECE OF BATTING

CUTTING-

WOF = Width of Fabric (approx. 42")

FROM THE ROBINS EGG BELLA SOLID:

Cut (10) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (38) 10" × 10" squares

CUTTING, CONT. -

FROM THE OFF WHITE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (10) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (38) 10" × 10" squares
Cut (7) 41/4" × WOF strips. Set aside for border.

Cut (11) 2" × WOF strips. Set aside seven strips for quilt assembly. From remaining four strips, cut:

- (12) 2" × 12½" vertical sashing strips

FROM THE BINDING FABRIC:

Cut (7) 21/2" × WOF strips

MAKING THE BLOCK UNITS:

Fabrics are sewn with right sides together. Refer to this video where Lissa Alexander shows you how to use the Cake Mix Recipe papers.

HST = Half-square Triangle

- 1. Layer one *Off White* 10" square onto a *Robins Egg* 10" square. Lining up the edges of the fabric squares, pin a *Cake Mix Recipe 7* recipe card on top.
- 2. Beginning at the star, stitch the layers together on the dashed lines in the direction of the arrows.
- 3. Cut apart using the solid lines. Press seams toward the darker fabric, gently tear away the paper, and trim away the points to make four $3\frac{1}{2}$ " × $3\frac{1}{2}$ " HST units and (16) 2" × 2" HST units.
- 4. Repeat to stitch a total of 38 recipe cards to make (152) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " × $3\frac{1}{2}$ " HST units and (608) 2" × 2" HST units. Set aside (32) 2" × 2" HST units for another project or use in a pieced backing.



MAKING THE BLOCKS -

Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Refer to arrows for pressing.


5. Lay out four 2" × 2" HST units, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make a unit measuring 31/2" × 31/2". Make 128.








6. Gather two units from step 5 and two 31/2" × 31/2" HST units; lay out as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make a Four Patch unit measuring 61/2" × 61/2". Make 64.




7. Lay out four Four Patch units, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make the Cream Puffs block measuring 121/2" × 121/2". Make 16.

8. Sew together two 2" × 2" HST units to make a small Flying Geese unit measuring 2" × 31/2". Make 32. Using two 31/2" × 31/2" HST units, sew together in the same way to make a large Flying Geese unit measuring 31/2" × 61/2". Make 12.






**Alternate Layout does not use any of the large triangles of color Robin's Egg so there will be extras of these shapes in color 85 to use in borders and other projects. Will still need same yardages and aditional white yardages to do this layout.

ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING

9. Join 16 small Flying Geese units and six large Flying Geese units into a row, as shown. Row measures 31/2" × 601/2". Make 2.






Refer to the quilt assembly on page 5.

- 10. Lay out the (16) Cream Puff blocks and the (12) $2'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$ vertical white sashing strips into four rows of four blocks each, placing the sashing strips between blocks. Sew the blocks and sashing strips together into rows.
- 11. Making horizontal sashing strips: Join three white $2" \times WOF$ strips together using diagonal seams to make one long strip. From the strip subcut three horizontal sashing strips measuring $2" \times 53"$. Lay out the strips in between the block rows and sew together to make the quilt center. Quilt center measures $53" \times 53"$.
- 12. Making and attaching side border strips: Sew three $4\frac{1}{4}$ " × WOF white border strips together using diagonal seams to create one long strip. From strip, subcut two $4\frac{1}{4}$ " × 53" strips and sew to each side of the quilt center. Quilt top measures 53" × $60\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 13. Join the remaining three $2" \times WOF$ white strips using diagonal seams to make one long strip. From the strip, cut two $2" \times 60\%$ lengths and attach to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top.
- 14. Paying attention to orientation, lay out the two Flying Geese rows made in step 9. Join the rows to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top.
- 15. Sew together the remaining three 41/4" × WOF strips using diagonal seams to make one long strip. From the strip, cut two strips measuring 41/4" × 601/2". Join strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top. Quilt top measures 601/2" × 691/2".
- 16. Prepare backing. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired.
- 17. Trim the batting and backing even with the quilt top.
- 18. Sew the seven binding strips together using diagonal seams. Bind the edges of the quilt to finish. Enjoy!
