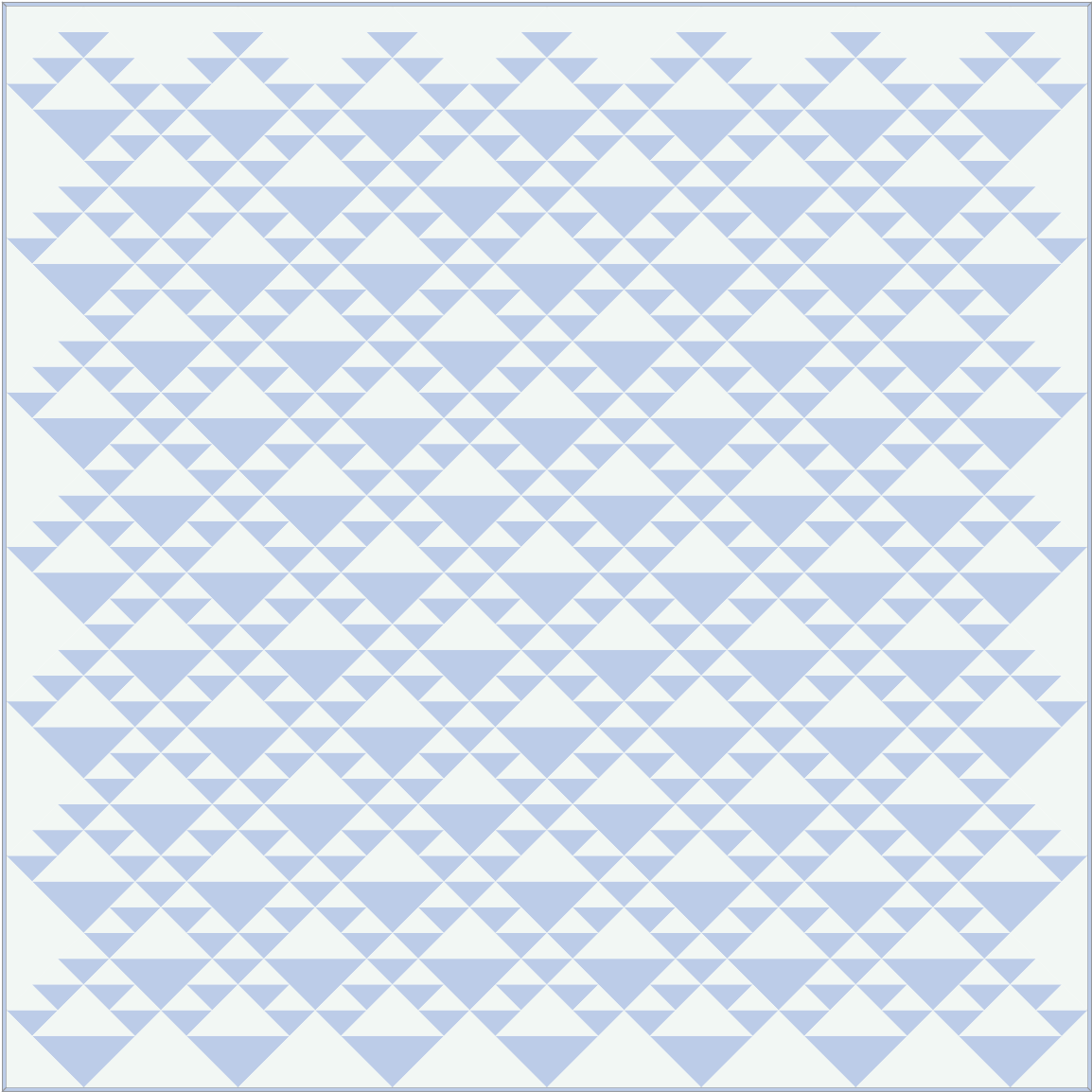

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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

3¹/₄ YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, LIGHT BLUE
BLOCKS



9900 63

4¹/₈ YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, OFF WHITE
BLOCKS, SETTING TRIANGLES

5⁵/₈ YARD - BINDING

4³/₈ YARDS - BACKING

SUPPLIES

(1) CAKE MIX RECIPE 2 FOUNDATION RECIPE CARDS

77" × 77" PIECE OF BATTING

CUTTING

WOF = Width of Fabric (approx. 42")

FROM THE LIGHT BLUE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (43) 10" × 10" squares

CUTTING, CONT.

FROM THE OFF WHITE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (2) 10⁷/₈" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (6) 10⁷/₈" × 10⁷/₈" squares. Cut each square twice diagonally for 24 side setting triangles.
Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (43) 10" × 10" squares
Cut (1) 5³/₄" × WOF strip. From strip, cut:
- (2) 5³/₄" × 5³/₄" squares. Cut each square once diagonally for four corner triangles.

FROM THE BINDING FABRIC:

Cut (8) 2¹/₂" × WOF strips

MAKING THE BLOCK UNITS

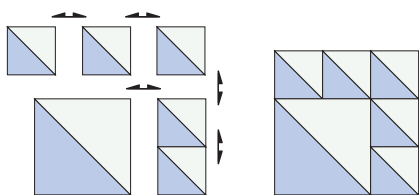
Fabrics are sewn with right sides together. Refer to [this video](#) where Lissa Alexander shows you how to use the Cake Mix Recipe papers.
HST = Half-square Triangle

1. Layer one Off White 10" square onto a Light Blue 10" square. Lining up the edges of the fabric squares, pin a Cake Mix Recipe 2 recipe card on top.
2. Beginning at the star, stitch the layers together on the dashed lines in the direction of the arrows.
3. Cut apart using the solid lines. Press seams toward the darker fabric, gently tear away the paper, and trim away the points to make two 5" × 5" HST units and (10) 2³/₄" × 2³/₄" HST units.
4. Repeat to stitch a total of 43 recipe cards to make (86) 5" × 5" HST units and (430) 2³/₄" × 2³/₄" HST units. Set aside one 5" HST unit and five 2³/₄" HST units for another project or use in a pieced backing (makes one block).

MAKING THE BLOCKS

Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance. Refer to arrows for pressing.

5. Lay out five $2\frac{3}{4}'' \times 2\frac{3}{4}''$ HST units and one $5'' \times 5''$ HST unit, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make the Croquembouche block. Block measures $7\frac{1}{4}'' \times 7\frac{1}{4}''$. Make 85.

ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING

Refer to the quilt assembly diagram on page 4.

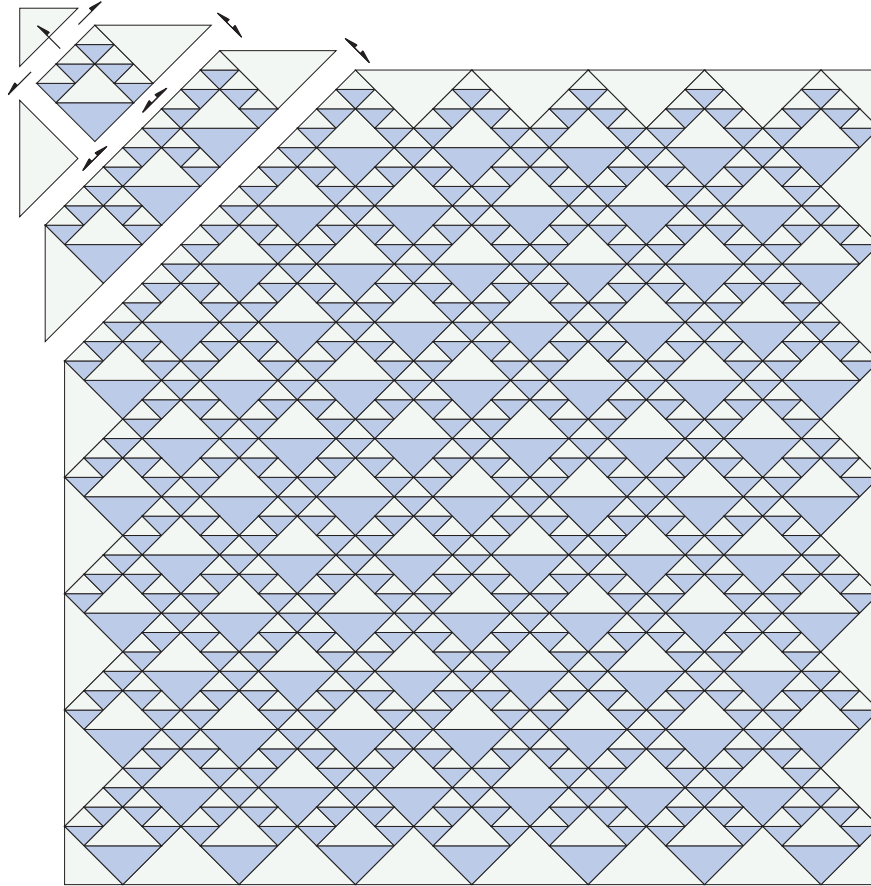
6. Lay out the (85) Croquembouche blocks, the four white corner triangles, and the (24) side setting triangles into diagonal rows. Join together into diagonal rows. Join the rows together to make the quilt top measuring $67\frac{3}{8}'' \times 67\frac{3}{8}''$.

7. Prepare backing. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired.

8. Trim the batting and backing even with the quilt top.

9. Sew the eight binding strips together using diagonal seams. Bind the edges of the quilt to finish. Enjoy!
