

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

31/4 YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, LOTUS
BLOCKS

43/4 YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, OFF WHITE BLOCKS, SETTING TRIANGLES, BORDER



2/3 YARD - BINDING

5 YARDS - BACKING

SUPPLIES -

(1) CAKE MIX RECIPE 3 FOUNDATION RECIPE CARDS

(1) CAKE MIX RECIPE 4 FOUNDATION RECIPE CARDS



82" × 88" PIECE OF BATTING

CUTTING-

WOF = Width of Fabric (approx. 42")

FROM THE LOTUS BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:

- (41) 10" × 10" squares

FROM THE OFF WHITE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:

- (41) 10" × 10" squares
- (12) 41/2" × 41/2" squares

Cut (3) 7" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:

- (12) 7" × 7" squares. Cut each square in half twice diagonally for 48 side setting triangles (two are extra).
- (2) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " × $3\frac{3}{4}$ " squares. Cut each square in half once diagonally for 4 corner setting triangles.

Cut (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " × WOF strip. From strip, cut:

- (8) 41/2" × 41/2" squares

Cut (12) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × WOF strips. Set aside (9) for border. From the remaining (3) strips, cut:

- (40) 21/2" × 21/2" squares

FROM THE BINDING FABRIC:

Cut (9) 21/2" × WOF strips

MAKING THE BLOCK UNITS

Fabrics are sewn with right sides together. Refer to this video where Lissa Alexander shows you how to use the Cake Mix Recipe papers.


HST = Half-Square Triangle

- 1. Layer one *Off White* 10" square onto a *Lotus* 10" square. Lining up the edges of the fabric squares, pin a *Cake Mix Recipe 3* recipe card on top.
- 2. Beginning at the star, stitch the layers together on the dashed lines in the direction of the arrows.

-MAKING THE BLOCK UNITS, CONT. -

- 3. Cut apart using the solid lines. Press seams toward the darker fabric, gently tear away the paper, and trim away the points to make (18) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ " HST units.
- 4. Repeat to stitch a total of 19 recipe cards to make 342 HST units. Set aside two for another project.
- 5. Refer to steps 1-3 using a Cake Mix Recipe 4 recipe card with one EACH Off White and Lotus 10" squares to make eight 41/2" × 41/2" HST units. Stitch a total of 22 recipe cards to make 176 HST units. Set aside three for another project.

7. Lay out three 21/2" × 21/2" HST units and one 21/2" × 21/2" white square, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make a Four Patch B block measuring 41/2" × 41/2". Make 40. Feel free to place the 21/2" white square randomly within the layout for added interest before sewing the units together.






MAKING THE BLOCKS

Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Refer to arrows for pressing.

6. Lay out four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ " HST units, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make a Four Patch A block measuring $4\frac{1}{2}$ " × $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 55.


ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING

Refer to the quilt assembly diagram on page 4. Lay out the blocks and patches randomly to make your quilt unique. Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance.

- 8. Randomly lay out the (173) 4½" HST units, the 55 Four Patch A blocks, the 40 Four Patch B blocks, and the (20) 4½" white squares into 24 diagonal rows, making sure the triangles are pointing in the same direction. Arrange the 48 white setting triangles along the sides, top, and bottom edges. Place the four white corner triangles in each corner.
- 9. Join the blocks and fabric patches together into diagonal rows. Join the rows together to make the quilt center.
- 10. Sew the nine 2½" × WOF white strips together using diagonal seams to create one long strip. Measure the length of the quilt center from top edge to bottom edge. From the long strip, cut two lengths equal to this measurement and sew strips to the sides of the quilt center, as shown.

-ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING, CONT.-

- 11. Measure the width of the quilt center from side edge to side edge. From the remaining long strip, cut 2 lengths equal to this measurement and sew the strips to the top and bottom edge to complete the quilt top measuring approximately $72\frac{3}{8}$ " ×78".
- 12. Prepare backing. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired.
- 13. Trim the batting and backing even with the quilt top.
- 14. Sew the nine binding strips together using diagonal seams. Bind the edges of the quilt to finish. Enjoy!
