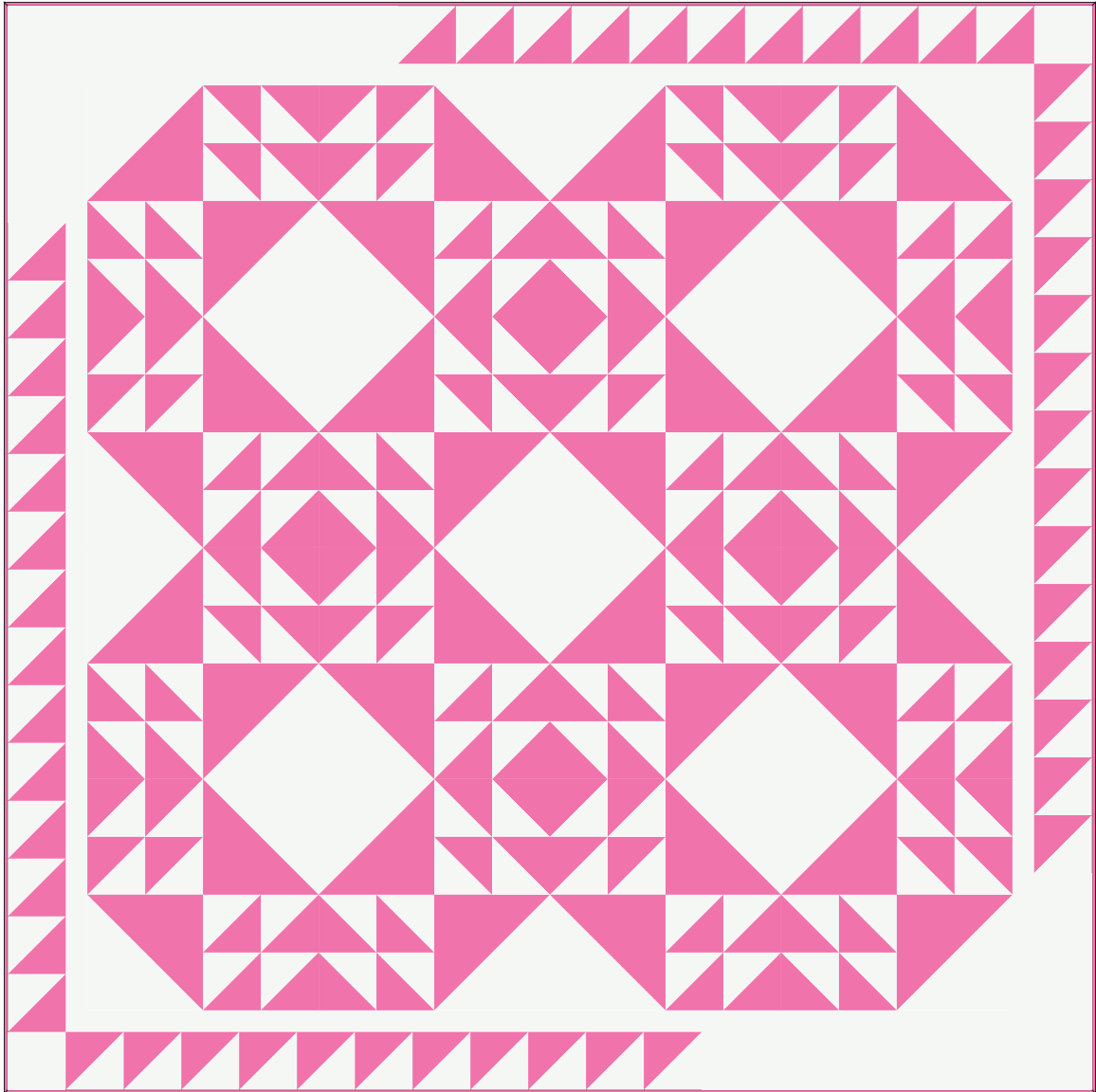

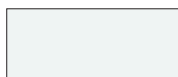
## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

¾ YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, PEONY  
BLOCKS, PIECED BORDER



9900 91

4 YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, OFF WHITE  
BLOCKS, PIECED BORDER



9900 200

⅝ YARD - BINDING

¾ YARDS - BACKING

## SUPPLIES

(1) CAKE MIX RECIPE 1 FOUNDATION RECIPE CARDS



CM1

85" × 85" PIECE OF BATTING

## CUTTING

WOF = Width of Fabric (approx. 42")

### FROM THE PEONY BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:  
- (42) 10" × 10" squares

### FROM THE OFF WHITE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:  
- (42) 10" × 10" squares  
- (2) 4½" × 4½" squares

Cut (2) 4½" × WOF strips. From EACH strip, cut:

- (1) 4½" × 27½" strip
- (1) 4½" × 11½" squares

Cut (8) 2" × WOF strips. Set aside for Border 1.

### FROM THE BINDING FABRIC:

Cut (8) 2½" × WOF strips

## MAKING THE BLOCK UNITS

Fabrics are sewn with right sides together. Refer to [this video](#) where Lissa Alexander shows you how to use the Cake Mix Recipe papers.  
HST = Half-square Triangle

1. Layer one Off White 10" square onto a Peony 10" square. Lining up the edges of the fabric squares, pin a *Cake Mix Recipe 1* recipe card on top.
2. Beginning at the star, stitch the layers together on the dashed lines in the direction of the arrows.
3. Cut apart using the solid lines. Press seams toward the darker fabric, gently tear away the paper, and trim away the points to make one 8½" × 8½" HST unit and four 4½" × 4½" HST units.
4. Repeat to stitch a total of 42 recipe cards to make (42) 8½" HST units and (168) 4½" HST units.

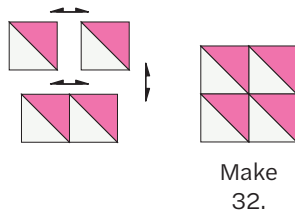
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**MAKING THE BLOCKS**

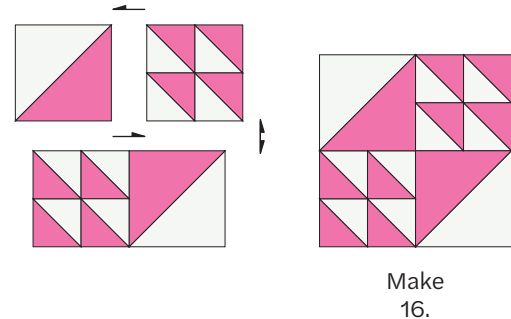

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Use a scant ¼" seam allowance. Refer to arrows for pressing.

5. Lay out four 4½" × 4½" HST units. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make a Four Patch unit measuring 8½" × 8½". Make 32.



6. Lay out two 8½" HST units and two 8½" Four Patch units, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make the Strawberry Shortcake block measuring 16½" × 16½". Make 16.




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**ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING**


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Refer to the quilt assembly diagram on page 4.

7. Lay out four rows of four blocks, rotating the blocks to create the pattern, as shown. Join the blocks together into rows. Join the rows together to make the quilt center measuring 64½" × 64½".

8. Using the eight white 2" × WOF strips, join together into pairs using diagonal seams to make four sets of joined strips. Trim two joined strips to 2" × 64½". Sew strips to each side of the quilt center. Trim the remaining two joined strips to measure 2" × 67½". Sew strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt center.

9. There are (40) 4½" HST units and (10) 8½" HST units remaining. Trim the 8½" HST units to measure 4½" × 4½" for a total of (50) 4½" HSTs.

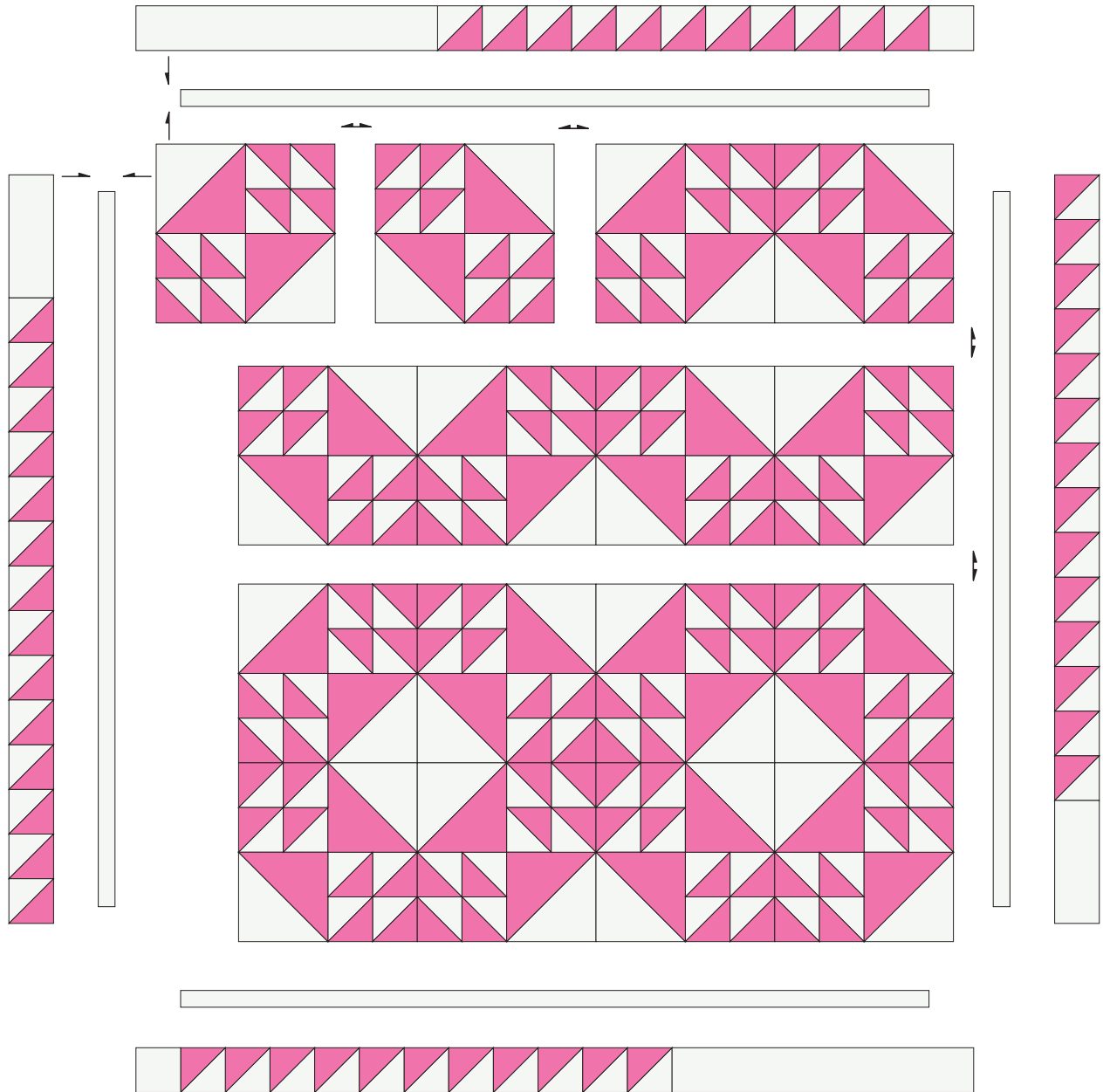
10. Paying attention to orientation, sew (14) 4½" HSTs and one 4½" × 11½" white strip together into a row. Make 2. Sew rows to the right and left side of the quilt center.

11. Join one 4½" × 27½" white strip, (11) 4½" HSTs, and one 4½" white square into a row. Make 2. Sew rows to the top and bottom edges to finish the quilt top. The quilt top measures 75½" × 75½"

12. Prepare backing. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired.

13. Trim the batting and backing even with the quilt top.

10. Sew the eight 2½" × WOF binding strips together using diagonal seams. Bind the edges to finish. Enjoy!
