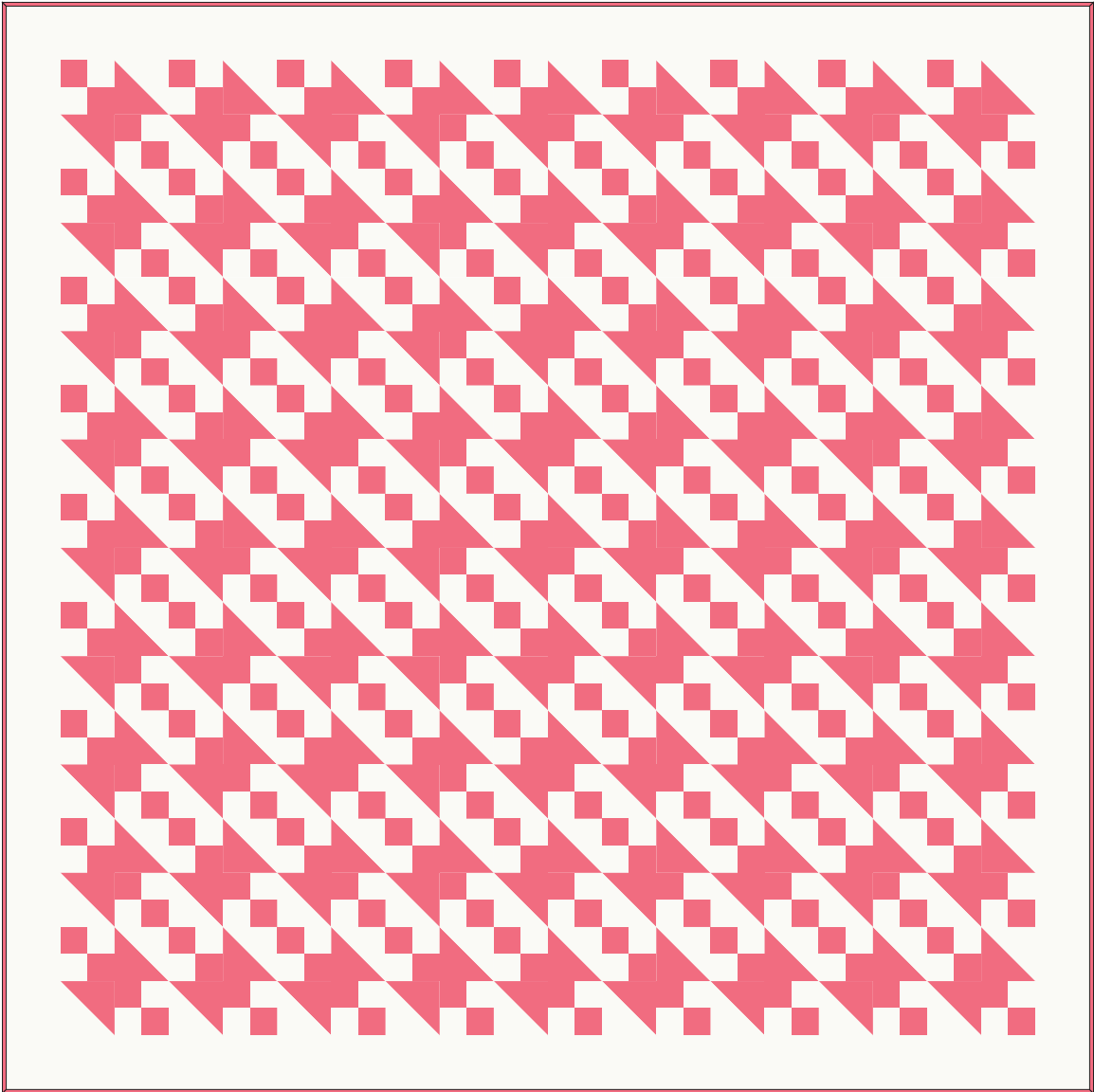

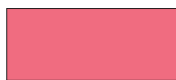

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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

3¼ YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, TEA ROSE
BLOCKS



9900 89

4¼ YARDS - BELLA SOLIDS, OFF WHITE
BLOCKS, BORDER



9900 200

⅝ YARD - BINDING

4½ YARDS - BACKING

SUPPLIES

(1) CAKE MIX RECIPE 5 FOUNDATION RECIPE CARDS



CM5

80" × 80" PIECE OF BATTING

CUTTING

WOF = Width of Fabric (approx. 42")

FROM THE TEA ROSE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (41) 10" × 10" squares

FROM THE OFF WHITE BELLA SOLID:

Cut (11) 10" × WOF strips. From strips, cut:
- (41) 10" × 10" squares

Cut (8) 4" × WOF strips. Set aside for Border.

FROM THE BINDING FABRIC:

Cut (8) 2½" × WOF strips



MAKING THE BLOCK UNITS

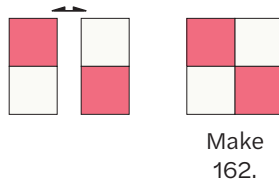
Fabrics are sewn with right sides together. Refer to [this video](#) where Lissa Alexander shows you how to use the Cake Mix Recipe papers.
HST = Half-square Triangle

1. Layer one *Off White* 10" square onto a *Tea Rose* 10" square. Lining up the edges of the fabric squares, pin a *Cake Mix Recipe 5* recipe card on top.
2. Beginning at the star, stitch the layers together on the dashed lines in the direction of the arrows. Stitch all of the dashed lines.
3. Cut apart using the solid lines. Press seams toward the darker fabric, gently tear away the paper, and trim away the points to make four 4" × 4" HSTs and eight 2¼" × 4" rectangles.
4. Repeat to stitch a total of 41 recipe cards to make 164 HSTs and 328 rectangles. Set aside two HSTs and four rectangles for another project or use in a pieced backing (makes one block).

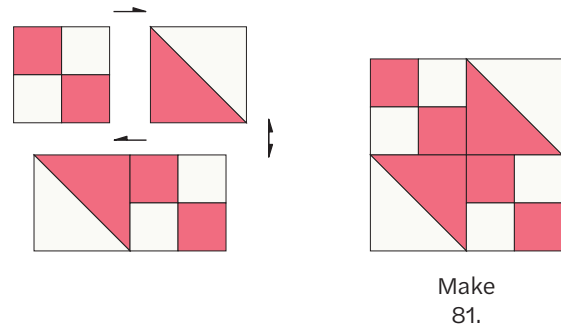
MAKING THE BLOCKS

Use a scant ¼" seam allowance. Refer to arrows for pressing.

5. Lay out two 2¼" × 4" rectangles, as shown. Sew together to make a Four Patch unit measuring 4" × 4". Make 162.



6. Lay out two Four Patch units and two HSTs, as shown. Sew together into rows. Sew the rows together to make the Tea Cakes block. Block measures 7½" × 7½". Make 81.



ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING

Refer to the quilt assembly diagram on page 4.

7. Lay out the (81) Tea Cakes blocks into nine rows of nine blocks each, as shown. Join the blocks together into rows. Join the rows together to make the quilt center.

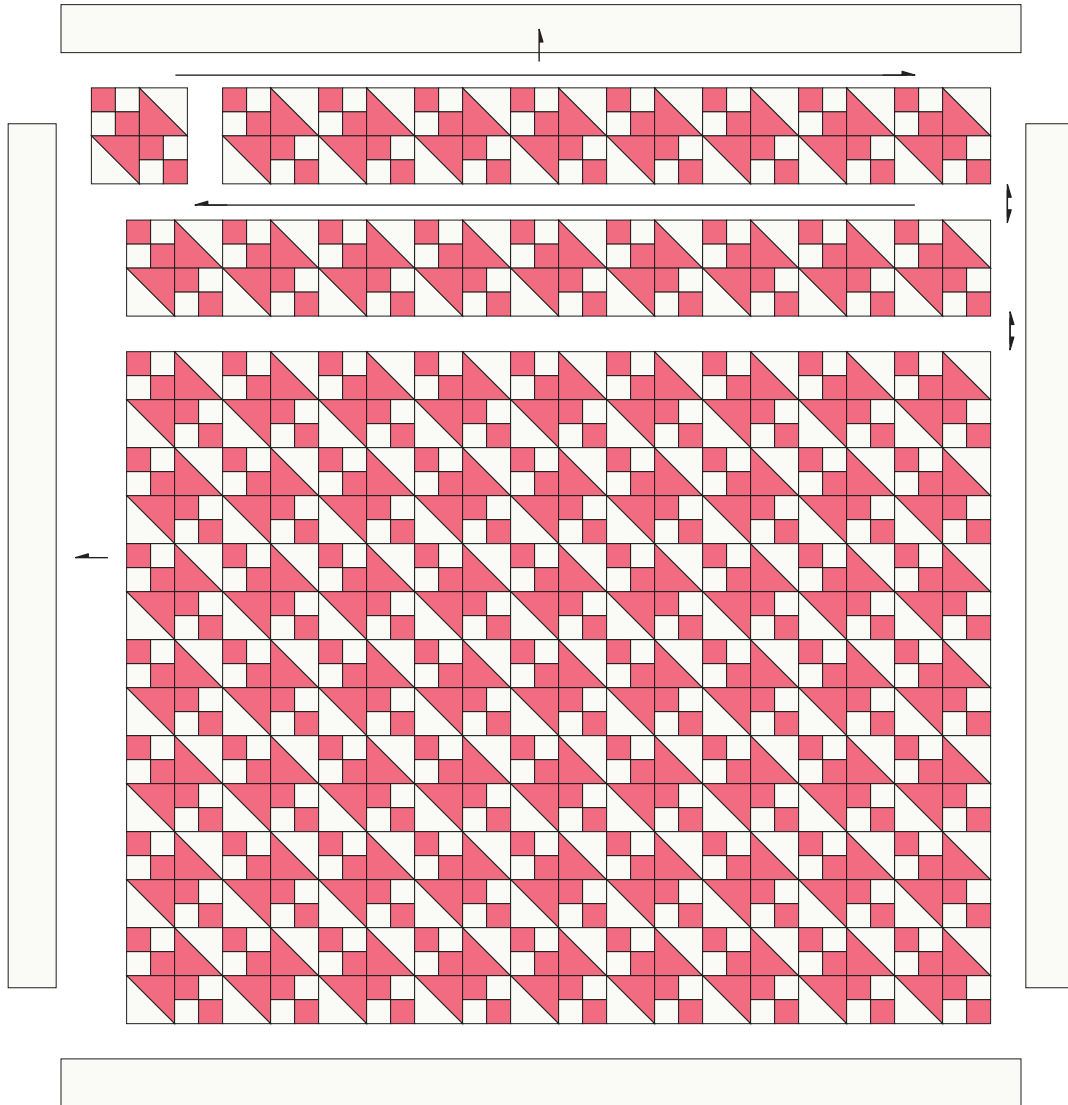
8. Sew the eight 4" × WOF white border strips together using diagonal seams to create one long strip. From strip, subcut two 4" × 63½" strips and sew to each side of the quilt center. Press toward strips. From the remaining strip, subcut two 4" × 70½" strips and sew to the top and bottom edges of the quilt center to finish the quilt top. Press toward strips.

9. Prepare backing. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired.

10. Trim the batting and backing even with the quilt top.

11. Sew the eight 2½" × WOF binding strips together using diagonal seams. Bind the edges to finish. Finished quilt measures 70½" × 70½". Enjoy!
