FABRIC REQUIREMENTS
Prints: 1 Jelly Roll* or (32) $21 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips Dark Accent: 11⁄s yards Light Accent: 1 $1 / 8$ yards

Binding: $5 / 8$ yard
Backing: 33/4 yards
*Jelly Roll = (40) $21 / 2$ " $\times$ Width of Fabric strips

## POCKET CHANGE

## Cutting:

From the Jelly Roll:

- Choose (32) Jelly Roll strips from the Jelly Roll. Cut the Jelly Roll strips in half at the fold to make (64) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ strips. If you want
 more variety in your strip sets, you can add more $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21$ " strips in multiples of 4 (i.e. 68 strips instead of 64).
OR
- Gather (32) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips. Cut the strips in half to make (64) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21$ " strips.


## Accent Fabrics:

- From both the Dark and Light Accent Fabrics, cut (4) $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips.
- Subcut (16) $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the Dark Accent Fabric, and (16) $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the Light Accent Fabric.
- Cut all accent fabric squares into quarters on the diagonal. You need (62) triangle pieces for each accent fabric.



## Binding fabric:

- Cut (7) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips.


## Assembly:

Unless specified otherwise, all seams are a scant $1 / 4$ ".
Jelly Roll Accuracy Tip:
When joining Jelly Roll strips, use a very scant $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.


Before pressing the seam, place the strip on a cutting mat, and place a ruler on the strip with the $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ line on the seam. Trim the pinked edge as straight as possible (you may just be trimming essentially fuzz but it still helps). The straight edge helps with accuracy when the blocks are assembled.


Trim away points on unfinished side

NOTE: To get the best results, be consistent with how the strips are lined up along the pinked edges. And measure along the way!

## POCKET CHANGE

## Strip Set Blocks

Gather (64) $21 / 2 " \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ half-Jelly Roll strips, and pair randomly into (16) sets of 4 strips each. If you want to use the full Jelly Roll and have more variety, feel free to make additional strip sets, you just will have leftovers in the end.

Join (4) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21$ " strips (making sure to use the Jelly Roll Accuracy Tip on the previous page to trim the pinked edges), to make one $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21$ " unit. Make sure to line up all of the fabric selvedge edges at the same side of the strip unit, so that you have the most fabric available to trim. Press seams open.

From each $8 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ unit, cross-cut the unit into (8) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2$ " segments. Start as close as you can to one end just in case of any cutting mistakes.


Repeat for all of the strip sets, until you have (128) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pieced segments of varying fabric combinations.


Mix and match the pieced strips into (32) sets of 4 strips each. Join the strip sets together, and press seams open.

Make (32) $81 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Strip Set Blocks.


Make (32) $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81^{1 / 2 "}$ Strip Set Blocks

## Quarter-Square Triangle (QST) Blocks

Gather the Dark and Light Accent Fabric triangles previously cut. You need (62) Dark and (62) Light Quarter Square Triangles.

Arrange into hourglass
 blocks with (2) Dark Accent and (2) Light Accent triangles each, alternating dark and light fabrics.


Join into pairs, pressing seams open. Then join halves together to create the block. Press seams open.

You can press to one side when making these if you prefer, but you will have bulkier seams when you get to the final assembly.

Trim each Quarter-Square Triangle Block down to $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ $\times 8^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$, with the middle point centered at the $41 / 4 "$ mark on your ruler.


Make (31) $8^{1 ⁄ 2 " 1} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Quarter Square Triangle Blocks.

## Binding

Gather (7) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF binding strips.
Join end to end on the bias to form one long strip. Trim seam allowances to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open.

Press strip in half Wrong Sides Together, so that you have one long folded strip. Set aside until after quilting, and attach and finish in your preferred method.

## POCKET CHANGE

## Make Quilt Top

Lay out the Strip Set Blocks and QST Blocks into (9) rows of (7) blocks each, alternating the prints and the QST blocks.

Rows 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 use (4) Strip Set Blocks and (3) QST Blocks each. Make sure in these rows that the QST Blocks have the DARK FABRIC facing toward the Strip Set Blocks.

Rows 2, 4, 6, and 8 use (3) Strip Set Blocks and (4) QST Blocks each. Make sure in these rows that the QST Blocks have the LIGHT FABRIC facing toward the strip set blocks.

Join into rows, and press seams to the QST Blocks.
Join rows together, and press seams open. Then, Baste, Quilt, Bind \& Enjoy!
